## Dates for your diary:

- Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October Family Woodland Walk at 9.30 am. All pre-school children and their parents/grandparents/ siblings are invited to come along with us on a walk to Illogan woods to kick leaves, collect autumn treasure and spot wildlife. We will leave the pre-school at 9.30 (ish). All children need to be accompanied by an adult <u>apart</u> from the children who are usually with us on a Friday morning.

- Thursday 29th March Training day for staff. Pre-school will be closed to the children on this day.

<u>Children's pre-school bags</u> - Please can we ask that the children's lunch boxes, bags and drink bottles are labelled. We have had a few muddles with bags and bottles going home with the wrong child as the staff learn whose bag belongs to whom!

<u>Parent Support</u> - We greatly value the support of our parents at Portreath Pre-school and feel strongly that the relationship we have with you all is of huge benefit to your children and the pre-school as a whole. We will be sending home a questionnaire in the next few weeks about your opinions or ideas for how things are done/could be done at pre-school and welcome any feedback.

Over the next few weeks we will be introducing our 'Bear bags' and 'Busy bags'. These will be for your child to take home and use with you over the week, before returning to pre-school. We will give you more information about them nearer the time.
